



Twin Falls Public Library 3D Printer Policy

The Twin Falls Public Library offers 3D printing services to make three-dimensional objects in plastic using a design that is uploaded from a digital computer file. User is responsible for operation of the 3D printer. 3D training is available upon request.

The Twin Falls Public Library's 3D printers may be used only for lawful purposes. The public will not be permitted to use the Library's 3D printers to create material that is:

- Prohibited by local, state or federal law.
- Unsafe, harmful, dangerous or poses an immediate threat to the well-being of others. (Such use may violate the terms of use of the manufacturer.)
- Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the Library environment.
- In violation of another's intellectual property rights. For example, the printers will not be used to reproduce material that is subject to copyright, patent or trademark protection.

The Twin Falls Public Library reserves the right to refuse any 3D print request.

By submitting content or objects, the patron agrees to assume all responsibility for, and shall hold the library harmless in, all matters related to patented, trademarked, or copyrighted materials.

The Twin Falls Public Library cannot guarantee model quality or stability, the confidentiality of designs, or specific delivery times. Refunds and reprints will only be available in the event of machine malfunction.

It is the responsibility of the patron to execute the design and product being printed. First-time users may request training to become more familiar with the printer and software.

3D Printer – Cost Sheet

All print jobs will be the responsibility of the patron. The software used will show an estimated time and amount of material to be used for the print. These estimated measurements will be used to calculate the cost of the print. The patron should review the project prior to printing to understand what the cost of printing will be. The patron will be charged based on time of print. The cost to print is \$1.00 for every $\frac{1}{2}$ hour, rounded to the nearest $\frac{1}{2}$ hour; e.g. 23 minute print = \$1.00 / 32 minute print = \$2.00.
